Dr. Weissman serves on the ACR #DitchtheDisk Task Force to promote interoperability in medical imaging, the new ACR Lung Cancer Screening 2.0 Steering Committee, and the ACR Well-Being Program Committee. He is Chair of the Veterans Affairs Committee of the American College of Radiology's Commission on General, Small, Emergency and/or Rural Practice Network Committee.
